DO YOU KNOW THE DIFFERENCE between a DKA and a DSA award? Do you care? Well, you should because you may be eligible for one or both of these honors. In response to a request from one of our members for some award clarification I present the following response.

The Distinguished Kiwanian Award (DKA) and the Distinguished Service Award (DSA) are quite different. The requirements for a DKA are determined by Kiwanis International and have been listed on the last page of the Tideline for some time. They include, sponsoring a New Member (probably the most difficult but satisfying requirement), participating in a Service Project, Fundraiser, attending Interclubs, Division Council, Installation or Governor's visit, and several other events. (See Details on the Last Page of the Tideline or talk to Frank Turner, Awards Chairman).

The DSA, however, is an award that originates with the local club and its' criteria is determined by OPK. It can be awarded for outstanding service to OPK and the community to a member that OPK wishes to honor without regard to any specific requirements. The club makes the selections, pays a \$150 donation to the CAL-NEV-HA foundation for each selection and traditionally the award is made to the recipient(s) at the Governor's Official visit. Now you know!!!!

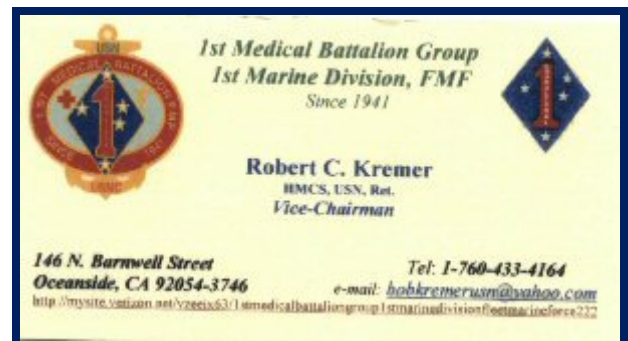

2007-08 Distinguished Kiwanian Award (DKA) Criteria

1. Sponsor a new member into any club in the district
2. Participate in a Club Service Project AND Club Fundraiser
3. Attend two (2) Inter-clubs AND one (1) Division Council Meeting
4. Attend your club or division installation or the Governor's Official Visit
5. Attend a Sponsored Organization Meeting or Convention.
6. Attend a Mid-Year Conference or District Convention.

Recognition for the Kiwanian

The philosophy of results oriented recognition and reinforcement is the central focus of the awards program for achievement in membership development.

Ring of Honor

1. Participate in the new member's orientation session.
2. Greet club members as they arrive for three meetings.
3. Attend one of the following: a Kiwanis inter-club, a division or district event, or sponsored youth meeting.
4. Attend a club board of directors meeting or a meeting of the new member's assigned committee.
5. Participate in a service or fund-raising activity.

Achiever's Pin

The Achievers Pin, which was introduced during the 1997-1998 administrative year, is available for individuals who recruit three new members within an administrative year.

Ruby K Pin

The Ruby K is available for recruiting at least five members to Kiwanis anytime during a Member's Kiwanis career, whether for one's home club or any other club
