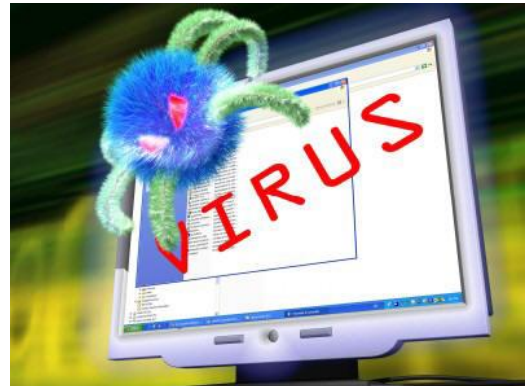

2008-2009 DISTINGUISHED KIWANIAN AWARD (DKA) CRITERIA

The Road to Distinguished

1. Sponsor a new Kiwanian into any club in the Cal-Nev-Ha District
2. Participate in two (2) Kiwanis Service Projects
3. Attend three (3) Service Leadership (SLP) Programs

Recognition for the Kiwanian (Kiwanis International)

“You Hold the Key” Lapel Pin Keys:

The opportunities to change the world one child and one community at a time are endless when we welcome new Kiwanians into our club. Imagine a world with a million Kiwanians! We could rewrite the future. To make it reality, you hold the key.

- Recruit 1 new member and receive a bronze key lapel pin.
- Recruit 2 new members and receive a silver key lapel pin.
- Recruit 3 new members and receive a gold key lapel pin.

Recruiting must be done between June 1, 2008 and June 1, 2009.

The Ruby K Award

By recruiting five or more new members during a member's Kiwanis career, a Kiwanian is eligible for the Ruby K Award. Ruby K pins are available for recruiting 5, 10, 15, 20, 30, 40 etc. up to 100 and multiples of 25 over 100. The award is cumulative so previous recipients are eligible for a new Ruby K when they recruit additional members.
