**Program**

Pamela spoke about Head Start and their various services. Head Start has three different sections: (1) Early Head Start which is for ages 0 to 2, (2) Head Start which is for ages 3 to 5, and FCCP (Family Child Care Program), which is home day care for pre-school children.

They begin with a pre-natal program which takes in pregnant women and teaches them everything about pre-natal care; the program also helps these women with medical bills, such as dental because sometimes there's a lot of problems with the teeth because the baby's pulling in the calcium. Head Start enrolls the mother in the pre-natal program, and once the mother delivers the baby, they enroll the baby in the early Head Start Program so both the mother and the baby are in the program. Head Start also has a curriculum that teaches the parents to interact with their children.

Then they go to the Head Start Program; they have pre-school children there & at the Catalina Center they have about 80 children.

Total enrollment for the Head Start Program is 990 children; Early Head Start has about 530 and FCCP (Family Child Care Program) has about 150 children.

Another good thing about Head Start is that they enroll at least 10% special needs children; the majority of their special needs children are speech delayed.

For each Head Start program [Early, Head Start and FCCP (Family Child Care Program), the have different service areas, for example, transportation which provides for field trips, Disabilities Department which supports them with their children with disabilities. They bring in mental health people – people who work with special needs children (for example inclusion facilitators).

Education Department services everything education at the center, such as ordering supplies, books, furniture – everything they need for the center that way
